a. Bellota Weir Modifications Project – Final Mitigated Negative Declaration

b. Bellota Weir Modifications Project – Notice of Determination

Manager Hopkins stated the District drafted a CEQA document for the Bellota Weir Project which was circulated for public review from September 16th through October 17th, and one comment was received from the State Water Resource Control Board (SWRCB). The boiler plate comments were addressed in the final document. District Staff requests adoption of the CEQA document for Bellota.

A motion was moved and seconded to authorize the General Manager to finalize the CEQA documents by approving and signing the Initial Study and Notice of Determination.

6. Stockton East Water District – CEQA – Fugazi Brothers Pump Turnout Project Memo, 11/01/22

a. Fugazi Brothers Pump Turnout Project – Initial Study with Mitigated Negative Declaration

b. Fugazi Brothers Pump Turnout Project – Notice of Determination

President Watkins stated the corrected handout indicates a pumping station is being built, not a box culvert crossing. Director McGurk asked how the Fugazi’s can have a PO Box in Stockton with a Linden zip code. President Watkins stated the address needs to be corrected, and the Board could approve the new handout with the correction.

Manager Hopkins informed the Board the Fugazi Brothers approached the District earlier this year to install a new surface water diversion. District Staff has been working with them through the process. As a first step, District Staff completed the development and circulation of a CEQA document. It was advertised for public comment from September 16th through October 16th. One boiler plate comment was received from the SWRCB, and addressed in the final document. Staff requested the Board authorize the General Manager to finalize the CEQA documents and approve the initial study, and notice of determination. This approval includes the newly corrected mitigated negative declaration handout provided at the Board meeting.

Director McGurk asked if the Fugazi Brothers are applying for a permit to change the diversion, or if this is a new location. Director McGurk also asked if Mormon Slough is different upstream than Bellota Weir; Manager Hopkins answered yes. The Army Corps 408 jurisdiction ends around Escalon Bellota Road, so this will require a 408 permit. Director McGurk also asked if this declaration is abbreviated because they're assuming the Bellota Fish Screen will be installed, and therefore the need for delays installing this is gone. Director Sanguinetti stated the diversion must be less than what requires a screen. Manager Hopkins stated all new diversions will require a screen for the HCP, but because the 408 permit is through the flood side of the Army Corps, and the Central Valley Flood Protection Board, regardless of the Bellota Project, they still evaluate every application for flood control impacts.

President Watkins noticed Fugazi is the applicant, but the address belongs to a Mr. Bockmon. President Watkins asked who the land owner is, stating 5503 North Fine Road is Mr. Bockmon's residence. Manager Hopkins stated he believes Fugazi is the landowner. President Watkins asked if they are applying for surface water conversion program, or groundwater being used. Manager Hopkins stated Fugazi is applying for the surface water conversion program, but the property owner must sign the application and will be confirmed.

A motion was moved and seconded to authorize the General Manager to finalize the CEQA documents, after verifying information, by approving and signing the Initial Study and Notice of Determination.

7. Dr. Joe Waidhofer Drinking Water Treatment Plant – Sodium Hypochlorite Project Monthly Update

District Engineer Evensen provided the Board with a presentation regarding the monthly update for October. District Engineer Evensen reported the project is presently at 54% completion. The metal storage building for sodium hypochlorite has been completed, and tested for secondary containment by filling up the concrete secondary containment foundation and walls with water and measuring water loss over time. Some minor leaks were discovered and repaired, and the area passed the test. District Engineer Evensen indicated construction is going well on the CMU building. The roof beams are in place, and metal decking will be installed soon. A major tie-in was installed in front of the Operations Building with existing six-inch pipe and new four-inch pipe. This new four-inch pipe loops the waterline by the Administration Building to provide adequate flow and better water quality. Southeast of the Maintenance Building, the pipe line was extended further to the east for future water fill station for trucks in case of any fire or drinking water needs. The key tie-in will be made

tomorrow, Wednesday between the existing eight-inch main and the new eight-inch rerouted main located between the filter building and the sedimentation basins 1 & 2.

Director Cortopassi asked how the District will know in the future where the pipes are located. District Engineer Evensen informed him Staff used GPS to locate the pipes in the future and all points will be put on the GIS map. He stated the old design could then be overlaid with the new GPS points showing the new pipeline modifications and additions.

E. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. San Joaquin County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Advisory Commission Meeting, 10/19/22

Director McGurk stated SGMA Implementation Grant Round 1 is a statewide competitive process rewarding grant money from the Department of Water Resources (DWR) for approved projects. There are nine projects in San Joaquin County for the first tier which should be completed within 20 years. Director McGurk stated a handout was presented by KSN (Chris Neudeck and staff engineers) regarding small communities. Funds were spent on flood protection feasibility studies. Statewide, DWR will award funds for 35 feasibility studies, six projects are within San Joaquin County (Banta, Kasson, Weatherby, French Camp and Morada). The evaluation to determine feasibility is to characterize the existing conditions, develop alternatives which can improve flood management, determine support from the community, and cost. There were three different proposals to protect the community of Banta. Mary Jimenez from DWR, connected online giving an update on Central Valley Flood Protection Plan. The deferred maintenance project at Dad's Point at Smith Canal is having trouble installing the pilings, so the contractor is suing SJAFCA. A public comment was made by Dominic Gooley regarding the lawsuit. Director McGurk noted the meeting time for this commission meeting has changed from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

2. Eastern San Joaquin Farm Bureau Federation – Water Committee Meeting, 10/25/22

Manager Hopkins stated that East Bay Municipal Utilities District (EBMUD) reported Camanche is 80% full of their historic average, so Woodbridge will not be receiving any cutbacks. North San Joaquin is still waiting on a permit for operating the DREAM Project. President Watkins stated they're waiting for a 408 permit to install a temporary pipe over an existing bridge. South San Joaquin Irrigation District reported the Bureau of Reclamation is still doing pulse flow releases from New Melones for the Stanislaus. And, San Joaquin County expects to have the Mormon Slough erosion repair project completed by the end of this year. President Watkins added the supreme court heard arguments from the Sacketts' in the petition vs. the Environmental Protection Agency in Idaho regarding regulation of wetlands (Rapanos v. United States).

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 10/24/22

Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 51,072 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 49 cfs. Current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River are set at 429 cfs and release to all water users are set at 0 cfs. There are 0 irrigators on New Hogan, 0 irrigators on New Melones, and 0 irrigators out of District. The water treatment plant is currently processing 38 mgd. The City of Stockton is currently processing 9 mgd. Manager Hopkins reported the District wells total water extraction is 6,884 gpm (~9.9 mgd).

2. Information Items:

Board Meeting – 11/01/22

Manager Hopkins noted item: F2a-1, F2a-2, F2a-3 and F2a-4.

Director Cortopassi asked if there's a reason why the City of Stockton doesn't use more of their own water. Manager Hopkins replied they're trying to maximize the use of the District's water. They have used more of their water when requested to do so. President Watkins stated his concern is they're passing up water they're going to lose at the end of their contract. SEWD could be reserving water in New Hogan, and the City could use this other water that's not used against them. When the new contract begins (January 1), they will have the same amount of water. President Watkins stated they should maximize their usage if they're foregoing water.

3. Report on General Manager Activities

a. ACWA State Legislative Committee Meeting, 10/28/22

Manager Hopkins stated he attended the meeting. There were five legislative proposals for ACWA to consider sponsoring – only two were approved by the committee for sponsorship, and three were requested to be brought back in January for consideration after additional research is performed. The two moving forward as ACWA sponsored legislation is to streamline the permitting process to the State Water Resources Control Board by establishing some statutory review period limits similar to the California Fish & Wildlife. And, establish a payment program similar to the Army Corp's 214 agreements. The other bill would add an administrative remedy requirement to Proposition 218 implementation before an agency can be challenged in court. This would require anyone challenging a Prop 218 process to work through the agencies' administrative process to address their claim before filing a lawsuit. Lastly, the DC trip for ACWA is scheduled for February 28th through March 2nd.

b. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Manager Hopkins stated he has been working with the county on securing funding in round two of the SGMA grant funding, and plans to bring a resolution for approval next week. That resolution will be sent with the application to DWR. The District's current cost for the application is approximately \$58,000. The Ozone kickoff meeting was last Thursday. District Engineer Evensen stated there were major tentative decisions made concerning injecting ozone into a large pipe, or ozone diffused air into contact chambers. Most facilities used diffused air. This works for the City of Stockton. The biggest hurdle is the siting of the lagoon or sanitation basins 3 & 4. Additional meetings will be required with the Board. Manager Hopkins met with NRCS last week to discuss funding opportunities. Currently, most funding available is on-farm. The only funding right now for an agency is to fund construction of a recharge basin. Manager Hopkins stated three farmers were inquiring about recharge, and is it possible SEWD can assist with these projects. Manager Hopkins stated NRCS will fund field flooding recharge, but not a pilot project for either reverse tile drains or dry well. Manager Hopkins reported the District has one employee out with COVID. And, the District's preliminary budget will be available for review by the Ag Ops Committee the week of November 14th. Staff will confirm a date with the committee.

Background

The Department of Water Resources (DWR) is administering the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA) Grant Program. The awarded solicitations for this grant use funds authorized by the California Budget Act of 2021 and Proposition 68 for projects that encourage sustainable management of groundwater, that support SGMA and/or invest in groundwater recharge projects with surface water or storm water, or improve water supply reliability. This grant requires the districts within each groundwater authority (GWA) to apply through their appropriate GWA.

Stockton East Water District (District) received support from the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority (ESJGWA) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) to apply for the SGMA Grant Program for the Bellota Weir Modifications Project and the West Groundwater Recharge Reservoir Project. Since both projects were selected for submission for funding by the TAC, the District can proceed with the grant applications in conjunction with the ESJGWA.

Summary

ESJGWA, with the District’s support is using a consultant to complete the SGMA Grant Program application. The estimated total consultant cost to complete the SGMA Grant Program application is \$70,000. The District’s share for Bellota Weir Modifications Project and the West Groundwater Recharge Reservoir Project is \$49,000 and \$5,250, respectively.

Table 1 shows the design and construction funding requests from the SGMA Grant Program for each district project.

Financial Impact

As a part of the District's FY 22-23 budget, the Board approved a \$120,000 under account 10-5116-0 Professional Services – Planning for structural evaluation of New Hogan conveyance system crossings. The contract for said services will be significantly under budget by an estimated \$90,000. Staff proposes to use the unspent funds to cover the costs of the SGMA Grant Program application. The total cost of the consultant for the SGMA Grant application for both projects is \$54,250.

Recommendations

District staff recommends:

1. Approving the consultant work to complete the SGMA Grant application for Bellota Weir Modifications and West Groundwater Recharge Reservoir for \$54,250, plus a 10% contingency of \$5,425, for a total cost of \$59,675
2. Using surplus funds under account 10-5116-0 Professional Services to cover the SGMA Grant application expense.
3. Adopting Resolution 22-23-13 authorizing the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority to submit an application for the 2021 Sustainable Groundwater Management Grant Program SGMA Implementation Grant and enter into any subsequent, related agreements.

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES UNDER THE 2021
SUSTAINABLE GROUNDWATER MANAGEMENT (SGM) GRANT PROGRAM SGMA
IMPLEMENTATION GRANT, EXECUTE ANY REQUIRED DOCUMENTS AND PROVIDE
DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Stockton East Water District (District) desires to file a grant application with the California Department of Water Resources for the Sustainable Groundwater Management (SGM) Grant Program SGMA Implementation Grant for FY 22-23;

WHEREAS, the District intends to construct the Bellota Weir Modification Project to improve fish passage in the Calaveras River, improve diversion of surface water for groundwater recharge, and improve water supply reliability;

WHEREAS, the Bellota Weir Modification Project Phase One is estimated at \$32,791,640 and the District will budget \$3,791,640 for FY 23-24 towards construction of the first phase of the Project;

WHEREAS, the District will submit a SGMA implementation grant application to the Department of Water Resources for improving the diversion of surface water for groundwater recharge at the Bellota Weir for \$14,000,000;

WHEREAS, the District is pursuing an additional \$15,000,000 in grant funding through the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and other agencies such as the Wildlife Conservation Board, California Department of Fish and Wildlife, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation;

WHEREAS, the District intends to construct the West Groundwater Recharge Reservoir Project to improve groundwater recharge;

WHEREAS, the West Groundwater Recharge Reservoir Project is estimated at \$1,501,500 and the District will budget \$71,500 for FY 23-24 towards construction of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Stockton East Water District that the grant applications under the 2021 Sustainable Groundwater Management (SGM) Grant Program SGMA implementation grant pursuant to the California Drought, Water Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection, and Outdoor Access For All Act of 2018 (Pub. Resources Code, § 80000, et seq.) and the Budget Acts of 2021 and 2022 be made to the California Department of Water Resources, and to enter into an agreement to receive the grant;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority (ESJGWA) has the authority and shall enter into a funding agreement with the California Department of Water Resources to receive a grant for the: Advancing Groundwater Sustainability in the Eastern San Joaquin Subbasin;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the President of the ESJGWA, or designee, is hereby authorized and directed to prepare the necessary data, conduct investigations, file such application, execute a funding agreement and any future amendments thereto, submit invoices, and submit any reporting requirements with the California Department of Resources;
