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

**A. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND ROLL CALL**

President Watkins called the regular meeting to order at 12:30 p.m. and Director Panizza led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present at roll call at the District were Directors Atkins, Cortopassi, McGaughey, Panizza, Sanguinetti and Watkins. Also present were Manager Moody, Assistant Manager Hopkins, Finance Director Vega, Administrative Services Manager Carido, Administrative Assistant Curtis, Legal Counsel Zolezzi and Consultant Barkett. Director McGurk was present via teleconference.

**D. SCHEDULED PRESENTATIONS AND AGENDA ITEMS**

1. Minutes 05/25/21 Regular Meeting

Director McGurk made the following correction to the minutes:

3. Stockton East Water District – Adopting Appropriations Limit for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 (Exhibit A)

Manager Moody provided the Board Adopting Appropriations Limit for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 (Exhibit A). Finance Director Vega reported this is just the announcement and will be brought back to the Board for consideration and approval. This information has to be made available to

the public 15-days prior to the meeting establishing the Limit for any public comment. This item was for information only.

4. Stockton East Water District – District Projects Update

Manager Moody reported staff is continuing to work on this presentation for Board review. This topic came up during the GWA Meeting as it was mentioned that no projects were getting done. Director Watkins mentioned that the District is in fact working on a number of projects.

Manager Moody reported Assistant Manager Hopkins and staff are working on a spreadsheet by project for the Board to see a snapshot with the status for each project. Manager Moody reported this might be good information to add to the District’s website on the SGMA page so anyone that is interested can see a list of projects the District is working on.

Director McGurk inquired if the spreadsheet will be fluid and can be added to when new projects emerge. Manager Moody replied yes, it will be a living document.

President Watkins reported Central is currently updating their pump station and the City of Stockton is talking about a recharge facility and new treatment options for surface water to take water to north Stockton.

**E. COMMITTEE REPORTS**

1. ACWA Agriculture Committee Meeting, 05/26/21

Directors Sanguinetti and Watkins and Manager Moody attended the May 26, 2021 ACWA Agriculture Committee Meeting. Manager Moody reported the discussion focused on the demise of agriculture. There was discussion on the Environmental Defense Fund putting up solar and discussing the crops that can be grown on dry lands. Director Watkins reported this is one of the most productive farmlands in the world and California is one of only five Mediterranean climates in the world and they are discussing fallowing the land. Director McGurk inquired if there was discussion on the media accusing agriculture of using most of the surface water. Director Sanguinetti replied that there was discussion; however, 50% of surface water is allocated to environmental and water quality purposes and of the remaining 50%, agriculture uses 80%.

2. Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Ad Hoc Budget Committee Meeting, 05/26/21

Director Watkins and Manager Moody attended the May 26, 2021 Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority Ad Hoc Budget Committee Meeting. Director Watkins reported there was resolution at this meeting for the cost splits and it will look similar to the last budget. It will be a 40/60 split with a minimum payment of \$8,500. And, an additional \$25,000 will be added to one line item. Matt Zidar mentioned at the meeting that this method will be easier to use because numbers can be plugged into a spreadsheet.

**F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER**

1. Water Supply Report as of 05/31/21

Manager Moody provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 136,856 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 170 cfs. Current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River are set at 602 cfs and release to all water users are set at 183 cfs. There are 9 irrigator(s) on New Hogan, 1 irrigator(s) on New Melones

and 3 Out-of-District irrigator(s). The water treatment plant is currently processing 32 mgd. The City of Stockton is currently processing 22 mgd.

Manager Moody noted items: F2a-1, F2a-2 and F2a-3.

Director McGaughey inquired on F2a-3 asking what the reference pots of water means. Manager Moody replied reservoirs.

3. Report on General Manager Activities

a. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Manager Moody reported that a meeting invite has been sent out of the Eastern Water Alliance (EWA) on June 7<sup>th</sup> and will be hosted at the District and via Zoom. Director Panizza inquired if this meeting is for the EWA Board. Manager Moody replied yes.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Stockton East Water District (District) is one of 16 groundwater sustainability agencies (GSA) that form the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Authority (GWA). The GWA completed the Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Subbasin (Basin) Groundwater Sustainability Plan (GSP) in November 2019. The GSP includes proposed GSA projects within the Basin that will help achieve Basin sustainability by 2040. The District is responsible for implementing two in-lieu recharge projects identified within the GSP with a combined expected groundwater demand reduction of 29,000 acre-feet annually (AFA).

**SUMMARY**

The District began partnering with landowners upon adoption of the GSP to assist with development and construction of the new surface water diversions required for in-lieu groundwater recharge. Table 1 identifies the projects, project status, and expected groundwater demand reduction.

The Board of Directors of Stockton East Water District does hereby resolve as follows:

WHEREAS, the California Legislature enacted Assembly Bill 797 (Water Code Section 10610 et seq., known as the Urban Water Management Planning Act) during the 1983-1984 Regular Session, and as amended subsequently, which mandates that every supplier providing water for municipal purposes to more than 3,000 customers or supplying more than 3,000 acre-feet of water annually, prepare an Urban Water Management Plan, the primary objective of which is to plan for the conservation and efficient use of water; and

WHEREAS, the District is an urban wholesale supplier providing more than 3,000 acre feet of drinking water annually (usually over 50,000 acre-feet), and

WHEREAS, the Plan shall be periodically reviewed at least once every five years, and that the District shall make any amendments or changes to its plan which are indicated by the review; and

WHEREAS, the Plan must be adopted by July 1, 2021 after public review and hearing, and filed with the California Department of Water Resources within thirty days of adoption; and

WHEREAS, Stockton East Water District has therefore, prepared and circulated for public review a draft Urban Water Management Plan and properly noticed the public hearing regarding said Plan on March 29, 2021 & May 15, 2021; and

WHEREAS, Stockton East Water District held a Public Hearing on Tuesday, June 8, 2021 to receive comments and accept the District's Urban Water Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, Stockton East Water District did prepare and shall file said Plan with the California Department of Water Resources by July 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the District's plan carefully analyzes and balances the tension between water conservation goals and the District's legislative directive to increase the use of surface water within the District for the benefit of the groundwater basin;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Stockton East Water District as follows:

1. The 2020 Urban Water Management Plan is hereby adopted;
2. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to file the 2020 Urban Water Management Plan with the California Department of Water Resources within 30 days after this date;



3. The General Manager is hereby authorized and directed to implement the Water Conservation Programs as set forth in the 2020 Urban Water Management Plan, which includes water shortage contingency analysis and recommendations to the Board regarding necessary procedures, rules, and regulations to carry out effective and equitable water conservation and conjunctive management programs;
4. In a water shortage, the General Manager is hereby authorized to declare a Water Shortage Emergency and implement necessary elements of the Plan;
5. The General Manager shall recommend to the Board additional procedures, rules, and regulations to carry out effective and equitable allocation of water resources, including the conjunctive use of surface and groundwater supplies.


